On Tuesday, the Government announced a temporary pause of confirmatory PCR tests. You are now only asked to take a follow up PCR test after a positive LFD test if you:

wish to claim the Test and Trace Support Payment

have been advised to take a PCR test because you are in a clinically vulnerable group

have been advised to do so as part of a research or surveillance programme

have received a positive day 2 LFD after arriving into the UK

If anyone has any of the main symptoms of Covid-19, you are strongly advised to take a PCR test, not an LFD test. If someone with symptoms has already taken an LFD test for any reason and the device is positive you do not now need to take a follow up test.

PLEASE BE REMINDED THAT LATERAL FLOW DEVICE TESTS MUST BE UNDERTAKEN EACH MONDAY AND THURSDAY BEFORE ATTENDING SCHOOL.

Please be reminded of the following uniform regulations –

- 1. When wearing PE kits, lower school must wear PLAIN black trainers or plimsols. Upper school must only wear PLAIN white trainers.
- 2. All children must wear a <u>regulation branded uniform</u> winter coat, available from Uniform4U.
- 3. All hair bobbles, bands and clips must be dark blue. Other colours are not permitted. Please ensure that any child with hair up to or below their shoulders must have it tied back in a ponytail (or similar.) Just wearing an 'alice band' is not sufficient.
- 4. Regulation branded water bottles are the only water bottles permitted in school. There are available at Uniform4U.

Unfortunately, the boaters and felt hats are no longer available to purchase from Uniform4U. The supplier has sadly had to close their business after many years, as a result of the Covid pandemic and Unifrm4U have been unsuccessful sourcing them elsewhere. These hats are therefore sadly no longer part of our school uniform. The winter wooly hats with our logo are still available and are the only acceptable winter hat. Navy blue gloves and scarves may be purchased from any shop – they are not branded.
