### **Yom Kippur**

Last Wednesday was the Jewish holy festival of Yom Kippur, occurring on the 10<sup>th</sup> of Tishrei – the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar. This High Holy day is one of introspection and repentance – the day of atonement. According to tradition, the first Yom Kippur took place after the Israelites' exodus from Egypt and arrival at Mount Sinai, where God gave Moses the Ten Commandments. Descending from the mountain, Moses caught his people worshipping a golden calf and shattered the sacred tablets in anger. Because the Israelites atoned for their idolatry, God forgave their sins and offered Moses a second set of tablets.

This Week we launched Black History Month with a re-cap of some key historical events in Black British History including Black people from Northern Africa settling in Northern Britain in the Roman times. We thought about slavery; recognising the huge part that England has played in such terrible events and considered racism from its meaning to its prevalence still today. We also listened to Natalie Cole's song 'Unforgettable' to remind us that we must never forget Black people belong here and their struggles to become equal.

On Monday and Tuesday, we welcomed our new Form 4 teacher Mr Musetti, who will be in again for induction next Monday and then starting with us full time after half term. We are very excited that he is joining our team and are pleased that he is embracing the St Martin's ethos of developing well-rounded individuals by accompanying Form 4 on their residential to Longtown.

On Tuesday, Form 5 and 6 went on their trip to the Science museum to consider their topics Space (Form 5) and Light (Form 6). A day full of learning was enjoyed by all and we would like to thank our parent helpers, Mr Leung and Mrs Ogenyemi for their time supporting this outing.

On Wednesday in was the turn of EYFS to visit the science museum to think about Space and enjoy the water garden which shows the importance of Science in everything we do and see in everyday life! A super trip and the children represented themselves and our school, very well. Special thanks to Mrs Nabi, Mrs Etakibuebu and Mrs Hyder for giving up their time to help.

Following on from their local artist visit, on Thursday, Form 4 took their learning outside by visiting Mill Hill Park and taking time to make careful direct observations of the wonderful landscape – noticing, appreciating and sketching the shapes, colours and tones of the autumnal trees in the gentle warmth of the sun.
