This week the children have been learning about remembrance and why it is so important not to forget the sacrifices made by others. They have read stories, poems and information texts about remembrance and the meaning of each colour poppy then created their own work around the topic. Form 4 presented their wonderful assembly about their residential and it was lovely to see so many parents in attendance to both this and the Form 4 meeting with Mr Musetti.

Next Week is Anti-bullying and Inter-faith week, please allow your child to wear **odd socks on Monday** to raise awareness of Anti-bullying and celebrate difference. An extended Monday assembly has been planned including the school council's anti-bullying PowerPoint and visitors from different faiths who will talk about the importance of their faith to them and the importance of tolerating and respecting all other faiths. Upper school (Forms 3,4,5,and 6) will be going to St Albans Cathedral on Tuesday as part of our events marking interfaith week and the children will be asking questions to an 'expert child' about their faith to foster interest in other peoples beliefs and develop understanding.
