This Week

We have been thinking about being brave. In assembly we heard a story about the first brave snowdrop of the year and were delighted to listen to Ella, age 4, sing Frozen's Let it go to the whole school – Well Done Ella!

EYFS had a wonderful animal mask parade and the children shared their animal facts – we were so pleased with their confidence to speak in front of the class.

In Form 1, the children were thinking about the feelings of the characters in their core text 'Where the wild things are' and considering their own feelings as well as those of other people. They completed some lovely writing about facial expressions!

Mrs Doherty has been practising her storytelling in Form 2 to share her version of the 'Battle of Hastings'. The children then considered historical evidence and primary and secondary sources to create their own storyboards of the event.

Form 3 enjoyed their Stone Age 'Wow Day' on Monday in which they dressed as stone age people would have, made caves and did cave paintings. They also completed their community litter pick on Thursday in conjunction with the Mill Hill Residents Association.

On Wednesday, Form 4 were dressed as Tudors for their 'Wow Day' and held court, putting king Henry on trial to decide whether he was a good monarch or not.

Form 5 have been conducting gravity and friction experiments which they have planned resulting in rockets, parachutes and ramps!

Darwin's theory of evolution and designing ideas of cam mechanisms have been the focus of foundation subject learning in Form 6 this week and the children have come up with some wonderful ideas of moving pictures and toys that we are excited to see the end results.

School Council – Anti-bullying

Bullying is not tolerated at St Martin's School. Bullying is traumatic for children and all people who have experienced it. Whilst we take every incident of poor behaviour seriously and deal with it in line with our behaviour policy; we do not want to negate the serious nature of bullying experiences by incorrectly using the terminology for one-off incidents. The school council have been working hard to ensure that all children understand the definition of bullying and it is only used in the correct circumstances.

"The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online'." ANTI-BULLYING ALLIANCE

There are four key elements to this definition: hurtful, repetition, power imbalance, intentional. The School council will be conducting a survey in RSHE lessons next week to see whether their assembly in anti-bullying week has been effective in ensuring that all children understand this and the importance of speaking up if you feel unhappy.
