This Week it was lovely to welcome everyone back after half-term and see the children settle back into their learning with excitement and focus. Father Steven joined us to discuss Shrove Tuesday as 'Sorry Tuesday' when Christians repent and turn around to the right path. On Tuesday, we celebrated pancake day with pancakes for dessert.

EYFS spent their Wow session at the park looking for 'mini-beasts' for their new topic and found all sorts of interesting creatures. They were working scientifically and focused on their observation skills – looking carefully for creatures and looking closely at what they found.

Form 1 were also working scientifically to investigate a range of everyday materials – starting with a range of examples, they elaborated on what different materials we use in our lives; considering their properties and thinking about how we use them whilst explaining which qualities make them fit for purpose.

Form 2 have been building the most incredible siege towers as a finale to their castles topic. This has involved a range of woodwork skills not to mention all the mathematical skills of accurate measuring.

Form 3 are studying the Wind in the Willows and rivers this term. They learned about the school teacher Annie Edson Taylor who was the first person to survive going over Niagara falls in a barrel – imagining how she felt and considering the reasons behind why she may have completed such a dangerous stunt.

Form 4 have been writing plays about the Mad Hatter as part of their study on Alice in Wonderland and were able to share these with our younger pupils today so they had a real audience for their work.

Form 5 also had their Wow session in which Mr Guyster carefully performed an Egyptian mummification on Miss Champion, explaining the process in great detail and placing her various organs in Canopic jars!

Form 6 have been using their critical thinking skills to consider aspects of Maya civilisation and design sculptures. We look forward to seeing the finished results.

The School Council were delighted with the new ceiling paintings that they had organised and have added a video to their page on the website which they shared with their classes.

Next Week Throughout the week - Children will be undertaking their CAT4 tests to help us consider attainment and progress in verbal, non-verbal, quantitative and spatial reasoning.

Tuesday – Children will be participating in the Hands Up Survey to consider how they travel to and from school. We would love to see the range of healthy ways you travel to school represented in this survey so if you are able to walk, scoot or ride your bike to school on this day, please do. Please be reminded to wear a helmet when riding either a bike or scooter.

Thursday – Is World Book Day. We love to see everyone's character costumes and the associated books coming in – please ensure any book is clearly marked with your child's name. We have lots of exciting activities planned to celebrate the wonderful world of reading including: an assembly, a whole school study of the book 'My Shadow is Pink', competition for the best decorated door, quizzes for lower and upper school and pick and mix reading activities throughout the day.
