Well done to our wonderful pupils and teachers.

Unfortunately, due to the weather, there were significant train cancellations on the Form 6 trip, which meant they had to return early after the mission and missed out on the Bank of England aspect. We are pleased to say that this has been re-scheduled for Thursday 30th March.

Form 2's litter picking was also postponed due to the poor weather conditions being reported. We will keep you informed of the re-schedule date and time of this activity.

This Week was National School Breakfast Week. Thank you to Mrs Doherty and our Healthy Schools Council who shared breakfasts from around the world; a different country each day.

On Monday in Assembly we talked about International Women's Day which took place on Wednesday 8th March and I am delighted by how well this was received. Thank you to the four different parents who took time to share their child's passionate responses at home and to the many children who have come to talk to me about their thoughts and opinions on this matter – I look forward to seeing some of the posters and reports you are creating as a result of our discussions.

On Tuesday, the snow brought excitement to the playground before school and we were delighted to see the wide variety of creative ways the children interacted with it: snow angels, snowballs, snowmen, noughts and crosses and even a game of icy table football!

EYFS have welcomed some exciting new guests to their learning environment – the caterpillars have arrived and are already growing bigger by the day. We are looking forward to seeing them form their chrysalis and hopefully turn into butterflies!

Form 1 impressed Mrs Mbah and Mrs Vietro on their trip to the Tate Modern to look at pop art. They were thinking about some of the key elements of Art – colour, line and shape as well as considering the emotions evoked and how art can be immersive. Special Thanks to Ms Nathwani, our parent helper, for joining us – we really appreciate your time and support.

Form 2 have been using a problem solving approach in their science lessons and have been thinking of ways that they can use everyday materials to make a mode of transport for a snail (instead of travelling on the whale). They have been explaining why the properties of each material make them suitable for transporting.

Form 3 have been building a 3D model of a river in their Topic lesson to help them consider the features a river has and explain a wide range of new vocabulary which they then used when writing their 'Guide to the Riverbank' in English. They have also been delighted to see that - in their 'observation over time' science experiment - some of their seeds, planted last week, have begun to germinate.

Form 4 have thoroughly enjoyed working on some adventurous maths with co-ordinates and shapes.

Form 5 have been writing a wide variety of pieces to explain their learning about Tutankhamun's tomb and hieroglyphics in their Egyptian History work.

Form 6 showed team-work and resilience in their attempts to escape from the mission rooms on their trip to the Escape Rooms. They have also made some wonderful clay pots and ornaments inspired by the style of Maya culture.
