This Week We were so proud of our EYFS children singing and speaking in their class assembly on Monday morning which forms part of our speaking and listening opportunities at St Martin's. It is wonderful to see how much they have progressed and matured in their time with us. We are so pleased that the children had such confidence to speak in front of such a large audience and grateful to all the parents who were able to make this special event. Thank you for joining us.

EYFS have had a busy week this week - also learning about the gingerbread man story, enjoying the start of their residential experiences at St Martin's at 'Bedtime Stories' and making gingerbread men in Kid's Kitchen - our food technology programme. Form 1 also enjoyed the 'Bedtime Stories' evening, bringing their favourite teddy and book to share with their friends. This year it was so hot so it took place outside under the shade of the gazebo instead on in the library and the children had a lovely time – please do look at and comment on the photos on Facebook. Form 2 have been enjoying reading their core text Pattan's Pumpkin this week (a traditional, tribal flood story from southern India) and writing persuasive texts to their friends as well as learning about fractions in Maths. Form 3 have been enjoying their core text Iron Man and writing information texts based on this. They have also been understanding magnetism through investigations in their science lessons and developing their scientific skills by making predictions and planning the method of research. Form 4 have been continuing their 'Journey to the River Sea' core text and thinking about the physical and emotional journey represented in the text. They have been having deep discussions as part of their speaking and listening and developing their explanations by reasoning their opinions. Form 5 are comparing their local environment with other places and habitats around the world. They are asking pertinent questions and suggesting reasons for similarities and differences whilst considering how this can affect the differing wildlife, particularly birds. Form 6 have been considering the arguments for and against animal organ transplant in humans in the context of their core text 'Pig Heart boy' and enjoying the continuation of their 'Healthy Minds' work delivered by visiting professionals.

The whole school were also taking part in the Spirited Arts competition this week, creating some wonderful pieces and explaining how they relate to the RE themes in preparation for our exhibition after sports day next week.

On Thursday, Form 6 will be attending the Barnet Junior Citizenship event throughout the day and EYFS will also be litter picking in the local area with Mill Hill Resident's Association.

Next week is also National School Sports Week, so, in addition to sports day, learning will incorporate maths in sport, profiles of famous sporting people and events and opportunities to learn about the history of different types of sport as well as trying some of these.
