This week our children thought about the British Value of 'democracy' in Assembly and how it can bring peace. They then experienced democracy in action as they delivered their speeches on Wednesday and voted for their favourite candidate on Thursday.

This week has been assessment week. Children in EYFS have been completing baseline activities to create their trackers in Maths and English as well as phonics assessments. The rest of the school have completed Maths and English assessments and PASS tests to establish learning attitudes.

EYFS have been drawing space pictures, creating a huge joint rocket and telling stories of rocket launches stimulated by their reading of the book 'Whatever Next?' as well as counting objects up to 5, 10 and 20.

Form 1 have been consolidating number bonds and counting. They have also been doing practical Maths - using their measuring skills in kid's kitchen to make gingerbread men. This supports the learning based on Hansel and Gretel.

Form 2 have started their core text 'Oliver and the Seawigs' and enjoyed a range of pirate activities including sea shanties with coordinated clapping in Music. In Maths, they have been counting forwards and backwards to 20.

Form 3 were writing similes to describe the monster Odysseus and create strong visual images for their reader. In Music they learnt a song about the story of Troy from an online session by David Grant which they hope to rehearse, record and send to him.

Form 4 have been learning about the place value of each digit up to a million. They have continued their text Ice Palace and investigated climbing equipment. In speaking and listening, the children formed questions for their visit from a climber. In Science the children have applied their knowledge of changing matter from last week to the water cycle.

Form 5 have been learning about the formula for speed, time and distance and answering word problems in full sentences. They have been understanding how to form a plan in bullet points and consider VCOP in their plan for an informative text. In Topic they have been learning all about the space race.

In addition to their online assessments, Form 6 have been doing some past papers related to their chosen pathway for secondary. In Music they were analysing an orchestral piece to consider the instruments used and the effect of different instruments, pitch, pace and volume on the emotions they feel.

Some of our Form 6 pupils, alongside Mrs Wilson and Mrs Vietro, will be representing our school community at the Dutch War memorial service at Mill Hill Cemetery to honour our allied soldiers by laying flowers.

Form 5 will begin their residential to Adventure Ways. We hope you enjoy every moment and make memories to last a lifetime. We will miss you!

Wednesday sees the start of the Japanese festival, Higan, which runs until Tuesday 26th September.

Thursday is International day of peace and children will be reflecting on different symbols of peace and what it means to them.
