**This week** We welcomed Zengha Wellings-Longmore from the RAF museum who told the children the fantastic story of Sam King. She encouraged the children to participate in the telling of the story with props such as hats and aeroplane models as well as pictures and musical instruments for EYFS to create a carnival atmosphere. It was a wonderfully uplifting assembly which the children thoroughly enjoyed and special commendations must go to all the children involved in acting – your confidence and expression was fantastic.

**EYFS** have been reading a book a day linked to Black History alongside their work on the core texts 'Pumpkin Soup' and 'How to catch a star'. In Maths they have been painting their numbers, copying the correct formation as well as using the interactive board and other large scale variations. They have also been comparing heavy and light objects. In English they have been reading and writing their tricky words with activities such as digging them up in the sand or hunting for them. The children particularly liked walking round the school on Thursday morning to see the Topic Homework of all the other children and coming back to find post-it notes of praise on their own work.

**Form 1** completed their wonder session on the book 'Owl Babies' for next half term thinking of facts they already knew and questions they want to investigate. They have been increasing the pace of their number bonds to 10 by throwing dice and counting on to 10. In English they have been writing sentences with rhyming words and writing a Thank you letter to Mr Mitchell for their visit to the synagogue last week. During British Values Day the children were thinking about individual liberty and understanding the British Flag. In Science the children have been thinking about garden plants and evaluating their broad bean 'observation over time' investigation. They were fascinated to see how one plant had died and the soil had become infested. In French the children have been learning to say and answer 'How are you?'

**Form 2** did their wonder session for 'Claude in the City' and have been writing adventure stories in their own chosen setting with their own characters and problems. In Maths they have been progressing their tables at their own current level, with some children working up to their 8x tables. In Topic the children have been drawing their own treasure maps and writing directions. In DT the children have finished off their light house projects and in Science they have been making conclusions about the properties of materials. For British Values day, Form 2 were thinking about Democracy with Mrs Boxer and creating some wonderful long pieces of writing.

**Form 3**'s wonder session was all about 'Escape from Pompeii' and in English they have been learning about poetry from Benjamin Zephaniah, Abe Gibson and Maya Angelou to create their own performance poetry. The children have been writing their own version of 'The song of the sirens' thinking about sounds Odysseus would have heard at home and on his journey and performing these in their own ways. In Maths, the children have been extending their use of fractions into addition and subtraction of fractions and word problems involving fractions of a whole. In Art the children have painted their clay pots and in Topic they have filmed their own Greek myths. In Science they have written up their experiments and in computing they have been thinking about IT networks. For RE the children were making posters to promote respect and tolerance which linked nicely to British Values day in which Form 3 enjoyed creating laws and rules for their own cities.

**Form 4** went to the National Art Gallery this week where they were enthralled in sketching paintings and understanding the artist's intent. They have been learning the story of Baroness Floella Benjamin including her experiences of racism, which she spoke to the queen about, and her journey to success in TV and politics. In Maths, the children have been learning the bus stop method for division of numbers with some children working in the thousands. In English, the children have been writing descriptive sentences to describe scary settings. For British Values day, the children in Form 4 were thinking about mutual respect and tolerance and considering people who have different life experiences but all deserve mutual respect such as disabled people, including those with Autism and people with religions different to our own.

**Form 5** have been thinking about the rules of divisibility, common multiples and greatest common factors in Maths. In English, the children have been planning exciting sci-fi novels. In Science, they have been thinking about the relationship between the Sun, Earth and Moon and in Art, the children made their Space related final pieces of abstract art. In their British Values Day, Form 5 were thinking about people who have had to overcome adversity to gain individual liberty. They have been thinking about the UNICEF rights of the child and how we demonstrate these at school and in British life.

**Form 6** have been analysing high level texts in their English lessons as well as practising exam papers. In Maths, the Form 6 pupils were creating algebraic expressions and looking for the Nth term. For their Wonder

Session, which was moved from the start of term, the children have been making sugar cube igloos and evaluating their processes and outcome against the design brief with what went well and what would make it even better. In Art, they have also been evaluating – thinking about their lino printing. In their Dance session, the children have delivered a rehearsal performance to Form 4 of their interpretive, modern, storytelling pieces. In French, Form 6 have been learning and using classroom language and in Music, the children were understanding ostinatos and creating their own group composition.

**After Half Term** the children will return to school on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October with an assembly about the history of All Hallows Eve and the meaning of symbols related to Halloween. Children will begin their new class text and most classes will be having their WOW day to launch their new units of work.

The first week back will also be IEP review week. If your child has an IEP and you have not yet booked your appointment to see Mrs Davies, please do so as soon as possible.

On Wednesday, Form 4 and 5 will be going to the British Library for their class trips this half term.
