We are delighted to announce the safe arrival of Mrs Hurst's baby boy into our world and would like to wish the family many happy times ahead. Congratulations! Mrs Cobbson has been appointed to cover Miss Hurst's Maternity leave. She started this week and will be in school on Mondays and Tuesdays. Many Thanks to Miss Hurst for such a detailed handover of information that has allowed the transition to be extremely smooth. Miss Cobbson has been able to begin her lessons immediately and continue curriculum provision in a similar style as both teachers are trained in the Kodaly approach. Thank you to you both.

This week

EYFS's week started with an exciting WOW session for their new topic, 'Transport.' The children bought their bikes and scooters to school and we set up a car wash and garage and they children got the opportunity to fix their bikes and then give them a good clean. They made Halloween decorations to make the front of our school look a bit spooky and they also had their first 'Welly Wednesday' – this involved a trip to the park where they played, investigated their surroundings and made beautiful nature portraits of themselves.

This week **Form 1** spent some time looking at their core text, Owl Babies by Martin Waddell. The children used the pictures and information on the bank of the book to write a prediction of what they thought might happen in the story. During maths, the children continued their bonds to 10, 20 and 50. Form 1 have also started to learn their 10x times tables, which they are achieving well. As part of their topic 'Memory Box' Form 1 are beginning to learn the terms past, present and future and wrote short sentences to describe what they might have been doing in the past, present and the future. During their Wonder Session, the children made some pasta moths for the Owl Babies to eat.

Form 2 have been learning about 2D shapes, recognising sides and vertices in Maths. In English, the children have been improving their extended writing by using adjectives to form expanded noun phrases. In science, they have been looking at animals and their young and which categories of young animals look like their parents. They have also been drawing plans of the school and classroom. In Art, the children are beginning their collage unit with observational drawings of school.

Form 3 have started their text 'Escape from Pompeii' by imagining they have experienced an earthquake in the classroom and then writing a descriptive piece including their feelings and senses. In Maths they have been learning about measuring length and converting between mm, cm and m. In science the children investigated solid building materials around the school and classifying them into natural or man-made. In Topic they considered volcanic pressures using coke and Mentos to replicate volcanic eruptions and considered the structure of the earth. During their art lesson, the children are looking at examples of models with moving parts to investigate how they work and consider techniques they may be able to apply to their own work. They have begun to make a flipbook animation using post-it notes to consider the process of animation. In RE they have begun to consider being 'Khalifah' - the concept of caring and respecting the world in the Muslim religion.

Form 4 and 5 have enjoyed their visit to the British Library to view some of the oldest sacred texts in the world and considered the importance of these as part of their RE learning. Form 4 were particularly interested in the Koran of Baybars and the bible of Henry VIII linked to their units of work. They have wielded a Viking sword whilst performing a warrior 'boast' speech in Topic and explored how to make a torch by creating electric circuits for science. They have used their descriptive writing skills to write a story filled with suspense and fear and used video editing to film themselves. In Maths, they have studied shape and coordinates. Art has including learning about Viking patterns and PE has included gymnastic floor routines.

Form 5 have been learning about long multiplication and square and cubed numbers in Maths. In English, they have been finishing their narrative writing linked to Space. Form 5 have been writing their sci-fi stories in English lessons this week as part of our final week of our Stargazers topic. They have been using their newly-learnt English skills engaging the reader through vivid imagery and stimulating senses. In science, they have been planning their own experiments linked to light and shadow and engaging in different types of enquiries. In French, they have been using adjectives to describe body parts, understanding how to make them agree in gender and number

Form 6 have been learning about rounding decimals to integers and up to 3 decimal places. In English they have started their new text, 'Tiger, Tiger.' In science lessons, the children have been thinking about the refraction of light and completing their group experiments. In Topic, Form 6 have begun to consider the reasons the Romans invaded Britain and discuss reasons for and against Celtic tribal people fighting against them. They have begun their use of apparatus at the gymnasium using the beam and trampoline. They have completed their e-safety learning by looking at signs of fraudulent websites and phishing. In Latin, the children have re-capped nouns and verbs.

The Eco-council are delighted to have received a donation of different size litter-pickers and protective gloves from the Mill Hill Residents Association to enable us to continue our litter picking initiative this year. More details about when each class will be out and about keeping our area tidy to follow soon.

On Wednesday, Form 4 are going on their residential trip to Longtown to see the features of mountains that they learnt about last term and enjoy a variety of outdoor adventurous activities.

On Thursday morning and after school, we will be holding a pre-loved uniform sale.
