Changes in circumstances

The safety and wellbeing of our children is always our priority at St Martin's, we ask that you keep us informed of any changes to personal circumstances so that we have all the relevant information to keep your children safe and happy. Additionally, if there are any events happening in the home which may be upsetting or unusual to your child e.g. family bereavements, parents travelling, visiting family members etc, please inform your child's class teacher or the member of our leadership team on the door at drop off so that we can fully support your child.

This week The children have enjoyed seeing all their friends and sharing their holiday news in EYFS. They have also been thinking about repeating patterns with different coloured objects in their Maths and enjoyed listening to their new book 'Oliver's vegetables'. They have used the theme of vegetables to write labels, descriptions and sentences about different vegetables. In expressive arts and design, the children have been drawing their own self-portraits by looking closely in a mirror and finding their facial features. In knowledge and understanding of the world, the children were thinking about Christianity and communion in particular by looking at special items from this occasion. In PE, EYFS were balancing, catching and throwing to help develop their co-ordination.

For Maths this week, Form 1 have been learning how to weigh the mass of objects using both non-standard (how many cubes) and standard (grams on digital scales) forms of weighing. The children have also started to learn their 3 times tables. In English this week, the children wrote about what they did over the holidays. They have also started to look at their core text, 'Where the Wild Things Are', by Maurice Sendak. They looked at the front and back cover of the book to try and make a prediction of what might happen in the story. For their Topic lesson, the children became palaeontologists and had to search for dinosaur bones in the playground and then tried to place them back together.

In their English lesson, Form 2 were thinking about rhyming words and using bullet points to write their new year goals which they had discussed and set in their RSHE lesson. In Maths, Form 2 were thinking about inverse calculations of addition and subtraction leading to 2-digit numbers and thinking carefully about the place value of their answers. In Topic, the children began their new unit of work on the Normans with a discussion about who should be the king after Edward the Confessor.

Form 3 began their core text, 'Stone age boy' with a diary entry written in the past tense and converting 1st person to 3rd person. Also in their English lessons, the Form 3 pupils were thinking about prefixes, suffixes and root words. In Maths, they were learning about angles and turns and in DT they have been investigating wheels and axels which originated in the stone age. In Digital Literacy, the class enjoyed finding images and text online to use in their Computing lesson when they were publishing signs and posters that conveyed clear messages.

Form 4 have been finding fractions of amounts in word problems in Maths. They too have started their core text by reading the blurb and making predictions about the 'Demon Dentist' and then finding quotes and making inferences from the text. In their Topic work, Form 4 have been learning about key figures in their Tudor unit including Henry VIII, his wives, Chancellor Thomas Cromwell and Cardinal Wolsey. In Science, they have begun their healthy eating unit by thinking about the different food groups and what they do for the body and in Computing they have started to use logo for programming.

Form 5's core text this term is 'Cogheart' and they have been enjoying a variety of Victorian objects to draw inferences from and launch their text. They have written interview questions for the characters and created a 'role on the wall' for them followed by a drama session in which they role played the characters in interviews. In Maths, Form 5 have been converting fractions decimals and percentages. In Science, the Form 5 pupils have been planning a variety of friction enquiries. In Topic, they have been thinking about the great exhibition and examples of inventions from the industrial revolution.

Form 6 have been watching versions of the whole school show for this year and begun editing the script with dramatic interpretations and personalisation. In Maths they have been thinking about linear sequences and in Topic they have been considering the nature of global trade to form their own lines of enquiry. In RSHE the children heard the famous Martin Luther King speech 'I have a dream' and were encouraged to think about their own big dreams for the future and how they might achieve these. In Latin, the children were thinking about genitive case and showing position.

PE

We were very impressed by the provision of Lower School PE last term. The lesson structure, skill development, engaging activities and behaviour management that Mrs Bent has implemented have led to calmer, more purposeful lessons that have improved pupil attainment and enthusiasm. As a result, Mrs Mbah has asked her to extend her role to include Upper School and we are delighted that Mrs Bent has accepted. Mrs Bent and all class teachers have received PE specific training, covering: the elements of every PE lesson, the progressive learning objectives relevant to the year groups, warm-ups, cool-downs, knowledge of health and fitness and assessment. Mrs Mbah will continue to conduct lesson observations and monitor the provision of PE as a specialist in this area and swimming will still be delivered by specialised swimming coaches.
