Golden Tea is an opportunity for children to show the work they have completed this week of which they are most proud, whilst enjoying juice and biscuits together. The following children will meet with Mrs Wilson during morning break-time on Monday –

Tiam Samarth Aman M Zayn Ali

This week EYFS have been developing their knowledge and understanding of different types of vegetables and herbs. They used a mortar and pestle to explore fresh herbs and this tied in with their literacy by expanding their key vocabulary. EYFS made a mix and wrote up the recipe and worked on starting a sentence with a capital letter. During Maths, they learned about tens and one's and how this will help us when doing addition higher than 10.

Form 1 have started to write their own story based on Where The Wild Things Are. They created their own characters, adding similes to their descriptions. During Maths, the children used their known addition facts and table knowledge to answer word problems. They have learned to find the important parts of the word problem to determine what operation they will need to use to answer the question. For our DT, Form 1 have started to create a dinosaur pop-up book fact file. They have also used their topic lesson to find and use interesting facts about their chosen dinosaur. In Science, they have continued to look at the features of different types of animals to classify them into their respective classification groups. The highlight of their week was definitely the trip today to the Natural History Museum to learn all about different dinosaurs and see the moving T-Rex.

Form 2 have made Rapunzel's hair lokshen cakes in Kid's kitchen during Food Technology. They have been to the Tower of London, built by William the conqueror to learn about castles and met a real knight who showed them around and trained the children to become knights. In English, they have been writing a book about how to defeat a witch to understand instructional writing. In Maths, they have been consolidating formal methods of addition and subtraction with exchange. During their Science lessons, they considered which materials will be useful to build a siege tower which will link nicely to their DT unit. In RSHE, the children consolidated their work with NSPCC on Stay Safe, Speak Out.

Form 3 wrote Stone Age diaries in English this week and learning about pictograms and bar charts in Maths. In Science, they investigated different materials to find out if they were transparent, translucent or opaque and in Topic, they created their own Stone Age cave paintings which they are displaying outside their classroom. In RE, they heard the story of Jesus and the leper and considered why Jesus thought it was important that we should show kindness to all people no matter what their circumstances. In DT, they continue to design and build their wheeled models and in IT they used templates and placeholders to create newspapers, invitations, leaflets and other desktop publishing materials. All this and learning to swim too!

Form 4's work has been based around their class reader The Demon Dentist. They designed a dentist drill with electric moving parts and wrote their own stories of a demon character with high level character descriptions. They enjoyed researching for their investigation as to whether Henry was a good or bad king using information found to support a case for the defence or prosecution. Maths was fun this week as the children continued their work on algebraic equations and finding the value of X. Badminton and swimming kept the children active and busy.

Form 5 completed their balanced arguments on the ethics around mechanicals being treated equally in Cogheart's society. They are now building their informative news reports; taking on the roles of investigative journalists and interviewing classmates who played different characters from Cogheart. They will use these answers to inform their news reports and give different points of view to their chosen topic. They have learned the difference between active and passive verbs to add variety to their formal writing. In Science, they learned how levers work and have built their own levers and pivots to help test how much force need be applied to lift a load. In Topic lessons, they studied a variety of Victorian sources to ascertain the negative impacts of the Industrial Revolution on the lives and health of the poor as well as how this benefitted the rich. In Computing, children have been using microcontrollers to program an L.E.D. and have been looking at the effect of a loop in their coding. In Verbal Reasoning, the class have learnt how to decipher number codes written as letters and vice-versa. During French lessons, the children described family members.

Form 6 took part in evolution workshops at The Natural History Museum. In RE, the children discussed the topic 'Who is God and do you believe in God?' also exploring world beliefs without a God including atheism and agonistic. In PE, they played Badminton and Tennis to develop racquet skills and in Football they focussed on defensive positions. During French, Form 6 learned key vocabulary on directions. For Art, they continued experimenting with close, closer and closest using charcoal as their media. Form 6 visited the Houses of Parliament; they visited the House of Commons debating chambers; the Central Lobby and St. Stephen's Hall. They went on a tour of Westminster Hall and learned about the history of the hall dating back to the 11th century. The children also participated in a workshop in which they discussed the importance of Democracy and the history of the significant suffragette movement.
