Krishav Alycia K Krishnan Iman

This Week Nursery children have taken their phonic knowledge and applies it in early writing. Reception children used their knowledge to decode words when doing a writing activity. During their Maths sessions, they focused on patterns, which they used to make a frame for their own gallery artwork. In knowledge and understanding of the world sessions, the children looked at names of mummy and baby animals that you find on a farm as well as the life cycle of a frog. During their Expressive Art and Design session, the children learnt about Vincent van Gogh and his sunflower paints and then had a go at painting their own sunflowers in a vase. They also learnt about colour mixing and creating different shades with water colours. During their Personal, Social and Emotional Development lesson, the children expressed what they are really good and what they can improve. This allowed for some really thoughtful and interesting, mature conversations.

During Maths this half term, Form 1 have been learning how to tell the time. They have also been revisiting and consolidating place-value facts. During English, Form 1 looked at the positive and negative aspects of living in a town and the countryside – drawing on information found in their core text, 'The Town Mouse and the Country Mouse'. They then wrote a persuasive piece of text on whether they prefer the town or the countryside and their reasons for this opinion. During Science, Form 1 continued with their 'Everyday Materials' topic, with a focus on learning about Charles Macintosh, the inventor or the Macintosh raincoat. This helped to show the children why different materials are best suited to different jobs. During their History topic, we looked at how London has changed since the Great Fire of London of 1666. We looked at the events of the Great Fire of London and sequenced events leading up the fire.

This week children in Form 2 have written list poems and persuasive writing based on their core text, 'The Bee who Spoke.' They practised reading scales in order to find capacity and have ordered volumes of liquid using this skill. They enjoyed a bug hunt in the front garden to launch their Science work learning about mini-beasts and can now name the parts of an insect. During Topic work lessons, they have been learning about Human and Physical Geographical features and can give examples of each. They have enjoyed several PE lessons practising their athletics skills in preparation for sports day and learning skills for striking and fielding games.

Last Week Form 3 enjoyed their WOW day introduction to The Lion The Witch and The Wardrobe. They met the wicked White Witch (a very hairy teacher in a splendid faux fur coat) and enjoyed enchanted Turkish Delights while watching some of the story. The rest of the week involved narrative writing based around adventures in Narnia and this week, the theme continued by writing instructions to create an enchanting spell which they will edit, perform and record. In Maths, they investigated some magic chocolate, which started with 24 squares and strangely still had 24 squares even when one had been eaten! Perhaps it had something to do with area... they have continued calculating and comparing shapes with different areas this week too. In History they heard the exciting and scary legendary tale of Beowulf and considered the characteristics of Anglo-Saxon heroes and villains. In IT they have been creating sprites and coding motion using Scratch. In RE, Kabir helped to explain why the Qur'an was such a special and holy book for the Muslim faith. Well done Kabir! In Science, Form 3 were very thankful to be visited by Mrs Sabir for a very interesting discussion around healthy eating, balanced diets and nutrition. Thank you Mrs Sabir!

This week Form 4 visited the science museum to take a look at their new sound and music interactive exhibition. They also looked at matter, sound and air pressure experiments conducted by museum staff. Ethan and Ariana were chosen to help with the experiments which demonstrated how air pressure can be stronger than the strongest human and how quickly liquid can turn to solid and back again. To end this exciting and informative trip, they looked at the flight gallery to find out about the types of aircraft flown at Hendon aerodrome over 100 years ago. During History, Form 4 role-played in a re-enactment of a class lesson from 115 years ago, meeting an old Chelsea pensioner, researched their own family histories and presented stories and facts about their families in class. Form 4 also found out about sound waves, sound vibrations and how the human ear detects these waves and vibrations. In DT they learnt how cam toys work and designed their own toy. Maths lessons have allowed the children to use and apply their knowledge of decimal numbers to problems about weights and measures, including multi-step word problems. In English the children have prepared elements of a fantasy narrative; finally writing their own individual stories inspired by their new core text - The Lost Happy Endings.

This week, in English, Form 5 have learned about Climate Change and Global Warming following on from Earth Day last week. They have researched cause and effect as well as facts / quotes and solutions. They then planned and started to write their own informative texts including television news reports, posters, newspaper reports and websites. They have also continued to study their class text of Floodland; they have analysed the effect of the author's language on the audience and what could be inferred about the characters from it. In Science, Form 5

dissected flowers and analysed the reproductive organs of a tulip; they asked questions about pollination (self-pollination and cross-pollination) and learnt how pollinators play a vital role in keeping our environment safe. In Maths, Form 5 have investigated the relationship between fractions, decimals and percentages and applied it to a range of questions and word problems in an 11+ style; they have used their knowledge to reason their ideas. In Computing, Form 5 have continued to create vector drawings using different tools including zooming, reshaping and resizing. In P.E., the children have started their topic of striking and fielding and have been learning how to accurately stop a moving ball using the Long Barrier technique as well as how to use the correct grip when throwing. In RSHE, they discussed the importance of having positive self-esteem and how to boost your confidence. In Form 5's Latin lesson, they learnt a new tense (the Imperfect) and applied it into English to Latin sentences with a focus on using the subject and object of nouns.

Form 6 spent last week finalising their projects from last term as well as enjoying Science Day and considering ways to reduce plastic in school for Earth Day. They were particularly shocked by the amount of plastic in the items we use and have been thinking of persuasive ways to change people's perspective when shopping and making decisions about products. Some children have even started a petition. This week the children have had a wonderful time at PGL on their weeklong residential of adventurous activities. They have learnt valuable skills about preparation, independence, resilience, compromise, teamwork, decision making and communication. Once again, the centre staff commented on their exemplary behaviour and manners.

Sun Safety

This week we saw UV levels reach a six - the red section - for the first time this year. We have put up the gazebo and the parasol in the playground to provide additional shade. Our Healthy School council have delivered an assembly to the rest of our pupils on Sun Safety to explain the importance of wrap, splat, hat — this includes covering bare skin, using sunscreen and wearing a sunhat to protect ourselves from the sun's harmful rays. Over the past few years, we have been developing the provision of Art in school by reviewing the curriculum provision, improving the language and analysis skills and increasing opportunities with gifted and talented club, our Spirited Arts exhibition and other competition opportunities. Mini Medics CPR Video

The founder of our mini-medics club provider, Mini First Aid, is raising awareness of the 'CoppaFeel' cancer charity. As a team, the Mini First Aid staff are attempting a 12 hour CPR marathon. To do this they are videoing 8 minutes of CPR each and combining these videos into a 12 hour piece. 8 minutes represents the average ambulance service response time in England for a Category 1 (non-breathing casualty).
