**Golden Tea** is an opportunity for children to show the work they have completed this week of which they are most proud, whilst enjoying juice and biscuits together. The following children will meet with Mrs Wilson during morning break-time on Monday –

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We were absolutely thrilled with our inaugural Grandparents' Tea event and delighted to be able to host 66 grandparents during the course of the afternoon. It was wonderful to see so many grandparents enjoying listening to their grandchildren explaining their work. The children, as always, didn't disappoint and were incredibly articulate, polite and well mannered. Thank you especially to the children who performed at the event. A wonderful time was had by all and we are grateful for the positive feedback and thank-yous we have received. Please thank your parents for taking the time to visit their children's school and taking such a joyous interest in their learning.

**This Week** EYFS children have been learning helpful words and using them in a sentence this week. They have been rehearsing lots of blending and writing CVC words. During Maths lessons, EYFS have enjoyed making repeating patterns in a variety of ways and looking at addition up to 20. The children have loved working on our spirited arts whole class piece and can't wait for you all to see it next week. On Monday, EYFS enjoyed their outing with Form 6 cleaning the litter from the streets of Mill hill. This led to some lovely conversation about why we shouldn't drop litter and why it's important to look after our environment.

For English this week, Form 1 have continued with their core text, 'Halibut Jackson'. The children have learned how to answer comprehension questions, making sure that they try to put some of the question into the answer so that we know to what they are referring. For their Maths lessons, Form 1 have continued with adding using the column addition method. Form 1 have developed and progressed their knowledge of column addition by regrouping (carrying) numbers into the next column. Form 1 have started to learn the difference between weather and climate. The children then used maps and atlases to try and locate countries that have a variety of climates. During RSHE lesson, the children started to learn about their bodies - specifically displaying maturity when learning the correct anatomical names for the parts of the bodies.

Form 2 have had a very busy week. They enjoyed a Multi skills inter-school festival with 21 other teams on Tuesday where they showed off their PE and athletics skills. They have worked diligently on their collaborative artwork for the Spirited Arts competition and are looking forward to this being displayed. During Maths they have found unit and non-unit fractions of quantities. In English, they have been delving more deeply into the character of Pattan (from Pattan's pumpkin) by interviewing him and then writing a play script based upon the conversations they had with him. In Topic, Form 2 began to consider the history of Mill Hill and how it has changed over time.

This week, Form 3 were busy making spectacular and thoughtful artwork for our Spirited Arts show next week. In English they made 'Wanted' posters to find the Iron Man. They also wrote persuasive speeches to rouse the townsfolk into helping catch him. During their Maths lessons, they have continued learning about tenths, hundredths and decimals. In Science, Form 3 investigated how magnetic forces can pass through solid objects and in Topic they examined hamlets, villages, towns and cities and how they compare and differ. Many children in Form 3 enjoyed sharing their work with their grandparents on Wednesday and are looking forward to showing their artwork at the show on Wednesday.

Form 4 looked at equivalent imperial and metric measures this week. They explored cubed numbers and squared numbers and square roots; they have also studied how to find perimeters and areas of complex compound shapes. During English lessons, they focussed on writing art commentaries for Spirited Arts and used 'Point, Evidence, Explain' strategies to answer complex comprehension questions. In Science, Form 4 studied adaptation to habitats and in Topic they have built and tested a river system. During Art/DT, the children tested out their DT models of completed cam toys and wrote evaluations of their work. This unit of work has been absolutely fantastic - the children thoroughly enjoying making their models whilst learning the reasoning behind them. Well done Form 4.

Form 5 have written informative texts this week - comparing Northern England, Iceland and the Amazon Rainforest's human and physical geographical features through their own enquiry questions. In Maths, the children have been learning statistics and interpreting line graphs, bar graphs and pie charts. They have evaluated their sculpture work in Art and learned about food chains and food webs during their Science lessons. During Music, the children in Form 5 have worked on song craft by creating their own lyrics to a beat. During Computing, the children have been creating video tutorials and in RSHE they have been exploring their own body images and discussing their thoughts.

In addition to Spirited Arts preparation on Tuesday, Form 6 have enjoyed a variety of excursions this week — On Monday, the children supported our EYFS pupils whilst they litter picked around the local area. In Forest School on Wednesday, the children made shelters by gathering their own resources complete with lounges, play dens and even a boudoir! On Thursday the children participated in workshops from: TFL on safety on the buses and trains and how to use an Oyster Cards; the Metropolitan police on knife crime and cycling; Hope UK on substance use; London Ambulance on Dr ABC and the London Fire Brigade on fire safety in the home. This is all part of the 'Moving On' curriculum, teaching our young people how to successfully manoeuvre life beyond St Martin's as they prepare to leave for their senior schools. Today the children have been to the London Eye to consider the architecture and create their own observational drawings in advance of their upcoming Art unit.
