This Week at St Martin's

F6 - Adam

This week in **EYFS** we took a look at the sun and found out that it is a big star in the centre of our universe. We explored primary colours and looked at the artists Kandinsky and Mondrian and how they used primary colours. We also created our very own art pieces. In phonics this week we have been working on our blending skills and the reading of 3 letter words. During Maths we explored estimation, including what it means when we need to estimate a number higher or lower than a certain number. In PSED, we have been learning to respect everyone in our class and focus on our friends' strengths.

This week in English, **Form 1** have been describing the characters from our core text, Hansel and Gretel. The children have been learning about and using adjectives to make their sentences more interesting. Some of the children have even started to use 'and' to join information together. In Maths, Form 1 have continued with their place value work. They have also been using the part-whole model technique to partition 2-digit numbers into 10s and 1s. During our Science lessons, the children have been learning about the different parts of a plant. They have all made fantastic flip books to explain what each part of a plant does.

This week **Form 2** have been learning and practicing a variety of techniques to help them add and subtract larger numbers using written methods. They have explored similes and thought about the characteristics of one of the characters in the book 'Oliver and the Seawigs'. In Kids kitchen they made sushi and seaweed crackers. They have also learnt to follow directions using the points of the compass in Topic, and went on a hunt around school for different materials in Science.

In English lessons, **Form 3** have been looking at the features of different types of diary entries, looking at how language can indicate the author's feelings. They have looked at how to use conjunctions and fronted adverbials to extend their sentences and how to use high-level vocabulary to describe aspects of the Stone Age. They have also started to plan their own diary entries, ready to write next week. In Form 3's Science lesson, they looked closely at how forces can affect a falling object. They generated their own aims to plan and create a fair test involving a helicopter and discussed how a single variable can affect its descent. They recorded their results and created conclusions from these.

This week **Form 4** have learnt to divide large numbers using the bus stop method. In English we continued our focus on descriptive writing, concentrating on the use of metaphors and personification. We ended the week by writing an extended story about an ice-forest adventure, applying our knowledge of higher-order language. In Topic, we have researched a chosen mountain or mountain range and built a man-made mountain out of sticks and rubber bands. In Science we looked at the mysterious process of condensation. In French, we learnt how to discuss the weather and answer questions about the weather and in Music we have composed and performed our own music on xylophones and glockenspiels.

Form 5 had an incredibly eventful week on their residential. However, they also had their very first Latin lesson in which they learnt Latin nouns and the verb 'to be'. In Topic, Form 5 learnt about different sources, looking at how they can ascertain information from them as well as discussing how reliable different sources are. They also found further facts about the history of Space travel and having found these facts, they discussed who won the Space Race: the USA or Soviet Union.

In English lessons, **Form 6** have been doing a variety of work linked to the 11+. They have looked at and analysed a text, answering exam-style questions linked to their class text, *Northern Lights*. They have investigated letter and number codes in Verbal Reasoning as well as sitting a range of 11+ comprehensions and compositions. Form 6 have been learning how to accurately use subordinate clauses in their Latin lesson, as well as how to accurately translate them into English. In Art, the children have begun to look at work by Inuit artists and from this research, have begun to sketch their own ideas of Inuit art.
